Overall record:	6-2	2-4	8-6	<p>PIPPINS USE BALANCED OFFENSE TO TAKE SERIES FROM KELOWNA: After failing to score in a Tuesday shutout loss to the Kelowna Falcons, the Pippins offense broke out with 9 runs on Wednesday to take a 9-4 win, and the series, from Kelowna. After falling behind early after 2 innings, the Pippins offense struck with a bases-loaded hit by pitch and a balk to tie the game in the 4th inning. In the 6th inning, having again fallen behind, the Pippins struck for 5 runs on 6 hits while batting around for the first time in 2019, capped off by Tanner Parker's bases-clearing double. Parker also added a 2-run homer in the 8th inning to cap off the big win. A.J. Wood earned his first win of the summer for the Pippins with 3 innings of scoreless relief. The Pippins scored runs off of four different pitchers for Kelowna to take the series.</p> <p>FOR THE PIPPINS: Left-hander Darius Garcia is set to make his second start of the summer for the Pippins, and his first at home, tonight against the HarbourCats. The 5-foot-8, 175-pound southpaw from UC Irvine made his first start for the Pippins on Saturday in Bellingham, and took a tough-luck loss. He allowed two runs, only one of which was earned, in 5-plus innings of work, striking out three batters and walking a pair. He allowed four hits in the outing. On the year, he is 0-1 with a 1.80 ERA.</p> <p>FOR THE HARBOURCATS: Right-hander DJ Peters will make his second start of the summer tonight for Victoria. In his first start back on June 5 in Wenatchee, the Mesa, Arizona, native allowed 2 runs, only one of which was earned, over 4 innings while striking out 4 and walking 3 on 3 hits. The righty out of Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College made 12 starts for Scottsdale in the spring, posting a 5-5 record and 4.39 ERA over 55.1 innings of work.</p> <p>PARKER PACES THE OFFENSE: Tanner Parker, the Pippins' everyday second baseman, continued his hot stretch on Wednesday with another 2-for-5 performance. Hitting leadoff for the third consecutive game, Parker extended his streak of multi-hit games to eight, and his hit streak to nine games. With a 5th-inning double and an 8th-inning two run homer, it was the first game in the streak in which Parker collected multiple extra-base hits. After collecting just 2 hits in his first five games, Parker is hitting .486 (18-for-37) over his current 9-game hitting streak. His .388 batting average is good for 8th in the West Coast League, and his 12 RBIs are tied for 2nd in the league.</p> <p>HOMETOWN BOY HEATS UP: After a slow start to the year, Yakima's own Henry Gargus has seen his bat heat up over the last 8 games. In those 8 games, he has collected a hit in each game, the second-longest hitting streak on the Pippins this season (Tanner Parker, 9). Over that stretch, Gargus is hitting .285 (8-for-28), which has raised his batting average from .133 to .231.</p> <p>WOOD STABILIZES THE BACK END: After starting the season on a short-term contract, Central Washington's A.J. Wood has been one of the best relievers in the Pippins' bullpen all season long. With 3 scoreless innings of one-hit relief on Wednesday, Wood picked up his first win, and saw his ERA drop to 0.87 in 4 appearances. After making a start in his first appearance of the year, Wood has come out of the bullpen the previous three times, and has yet to allow a run in those 3 appearances.</p> <p>ODDS & ENDS: With Tanner Parker's 8th inning home run, the Pippins hit homers in consecutive games for the first time since doing so in Ridgefield on June 5 and June 6...the Pippins have yet to lose back-to-back home games so far this season.</p>
